

## **2Tim. 3:2-5** (Glossary)

**Lovers of their own selves**-5367 philautos (fil'-ow-tos); from 5384 and 846; fond of self, i.e. selfish, 1) loving oneself 2) too intent on one's interest, selfish: KJV-- lover of oneself.

**Covetous**-5366 philarguros (fil-ar'-goo-ros); from 5384 and 696; fond of silver (money), i.e. avaricious, loving money, avarice: KJV-- covetous.

**Boasters**-213 alazon (al-ad-zone'); from ale (vagranity); braggart, an empty pretender, a boaster: KJV-- boaster.

**Proud**-5244 huperephanos (hoop-er-ay'-fan-os); from 5228 and 5316; appearing above others (conspicuous), i.e. (figuratively) haughty, 1) showing oneself above others, overtopping, conspicuous above others, preeminent 2) with an overweening estimate of one's means or merits, despising others or even treating them with contempt, haughty: KJV-- proud.

**Blasphemers**-989 blasphemos (blas'-fay-mos); from a derivative of 984 and 5345; scurrilous, i.e. calumnious (against men), or (specially) impious (against God), speaking evil, slanderous, reproachful, railing, abusive: KJV-- blasphemer (-mous), railing.

**Disobedient to parents**-545 apeithes (ap-i-thace'); from 1 (as a negative particle) and 3982; unpersuadable, i.e. contumacious, 3982 peitho (pi'-tho); a primary verb; to convince (by argument, true or false); by analogy, to pacify or conciliate (by other fair means); reflexively or passively, to assent (to evidence or authority), to rely (by inward certainty): KJV-- agree, assure, believe, have confidence, be (wax) conflent, make friend, obey, persuade, trust, yield: KJV-- disobedient.

**Unthankful**-884 acharistos-ungracious a) unpleasing b) unthankful

**Unholy**-462 anosios-unholy, impious, wicked

**Without natural affection**-794 astorgos (as'-tor-gos); from 1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of stergo (to cherish affectionately); hard-hearted towards kindred, astorgos-without natural affection, unsociable (Rom. 1:31 margin), inhuman (2 Tim. 3:3 RSV), unloving (2 Tim. 3:3 NKJV): KJV-- without natural affection.

**Trucebreakers**-786 aspondos-1) without a treaty or covenant; used of things not mutually agreed upon, for example, abstinences from hostilities 2) that cannot be persuaded to enter into a covenant, implacable

**False accusers**-1228 diabolos (dee-ab'-ol-os); from 1225; a traducer; specially, Satan [compare 7854]: KJV-- false accuser, devil, slanderer.

**Incontinent**-193 akrates (ak-rat'-ace); from 1 (as a negative particle) and 2904; powerless, i.e. without self-control: KJV-- incontinent.

**Fierce**-434 anemeros (an-ay'-mer-os); from 1 (as a negative particle) and hemeros (lame); savage: KJV-- fierce.

**Despisers of those that are good**-865 aphilagathos (af-il-ag'-ath-os); from 1 (as a negative particle) and 5358; hostile to virtue: KJV-- despiser of those that are good.

**Traitors**-4273 prodotes (prod-ot'-ace); from 4272 (in the sense of giving forward into another's [the enemy's] hands); a surrender: KJV-- betrayer, traitor. \*\*\*. prodremo. See 4390. 4272 prodidomi-2) to betray

**Heady**-4312 propetes-1) to fall forward, headlong, sloping, precipitously 2) precipitate, rash, reckless

**Highminded**-5187 tuphoo (toof-o'-o); from a derivative of 5188; to envelop with smoke, i.e. (figuratively) to inflate with self-conceit: KJV-- high-minded, be lifted up with pride, be proud.

**Lovers of pleasures**-5369 philedonos (fil-ay'-don-os); from 5384 and 2237; fond of pleasure, i.e. voluptuous: KJV-- lover of pleasure. 5384 philos (fee'-los); properly, dear, i.e. a friend; actively, fond, i.e. friendly (still as a noun, an associate, neighbor, etc.): KJV-- friend.

**Lovers of God**-5377 philotheos (fil-oth'-eh-os); from 5384 and 2316; fond of God, i.e. pious: KJV-- lover of God. 5384 philos (fee'-los); properly, dear, i.e. a friend; actively, fond, i.e. friendly (still as a noun, an associate, neighbor, etc.): KJV-- friend.

**A form**-3446 morphosis (mor'-fo-sis); from 3445; formation, i.e. (by implication) appearance (semblance): KJV-- form.

**Denying**-720 arneomai (ar-neh'-om-ahee); perhaps from 1 (as a negative particle) and the middle voice of 4483; to contradict, i.e. disavow, reject, abnegate: KJV-- deny, refuse.

**Turn away**-665 apotrepo (ap-ot-rep'-o); from 575 and the base of 5157; to deflect, i.e. (reflexively) avoid, 1) to turn oneself away from 2) to shun, to avoid: KJV-- turn away.
