

ALL SCRIPTURE IS GIVEN BY INSPIRATION OF GOD

2 Tim 3:12 Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution. **13** But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived. **14** But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; **15** And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. **16** All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: **17** That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works. (KJV)

2 Tim 3:16 All scripture **(1)is given by inspiration of God**, and **(2)is profitable** for **(3)doctrine**, for **(4)reproof**, for **(5)correction**, for **(6)instruction** in **(7)righteousness**: **17** That the **(8)man** of God may be **(9)perfect**, **(10)thoroughly furnished** unto all good works. (KJV)

Definitions:

(1) All scripture **is given by inspiration of God**-2315 theopneustos-inspired by God, the contents of the scriptures

(2)is profitable-5624 ophelimos (o-fel'-ee-mos);from a form of 3786; helpful or serviceable, i.e. advantageous: KJV-- profit (-able).

(3)for doctrine-1319 didaskalia (did-as-kal-ee'-ah); from 1320; instruction (the function or the information): KJV-- doctrine, learning, teaching.

(4)for reproof-5688 elegmos (el-eng-mos'); from 1651; found only in 2 Tim. 3:16: conviction (of a sinner), punishment, refutation of error, reproof. 1651 elegcho (el-eng'-kho);of uncertain affinity; to confute, admonish: KJV-- convict, convince, tell a fault, rebuke, reprove.

(5)for correction-1882 epanorthosis (ep-an-or'-tho-sis); from a compound of 1909 and 461; a straightening up again, i.e. (figuratively) rectification (reformation): KJV-- correction.

(6)for instruction-3809 paideia (pahee-di'-ah); from 3811; tutorage, i.e. education or training; by implication, disciplinary correction: KJV-- chastening, chastisement, instruction, nurture.

(7)in righteousness-1343 dikaiosune-1) in a broad sense: state of him who is as he ought to be, righteousness, the condition acceptable to God a) the doctrine concerning the way in which man may attain a state approved of God b) integrity, virtue, purity of life, rightness, correctness of thinking feeling, and acting 2) in a narrower sense, justice or the virtue which gives each his due

(8)That the man of God-444 anthropos (anth'-ro-pos); from 435 and ops (the countenance; from 3700); man-faced, i.e. a human being. 1) a human being, whether male or female a) generically, to include all human individuals: KJV-- certain, man.

(9)may be perfect-739 artios (ar'-tee-os); from 737; fresh, i.e. (by implication) complete, 1) fitted: KJV-- perfect.

(10)thoroughly furnished unto all good works-1822 exartizo (ex-ar-tid'-zo);from 1537 and a derivative of 739; to finish out (time); figuratively, to equip fully (a teacher), to complete, to finish a) to furnish perfectly b) to finish, to accomplish: KJV-- accomplish, thoroughly furnish.
