

TRANSGRESSION OF LAW

Definition: Transgression-3845 parabaino (par-ab-ah'-ee-no); from 3844 and the base of 939; to go contrary to, i.e. violate a command, 1) to go by the side of 3) to overstep, to neglect, to violate, to transgress 4) so to go past as to turn aside from, to depart, to leave, to be turned from: **KJV-- (by) transgress (-ion).**

Acts 1:25

25 That he may take part of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas by **transgression** fell, that he might go to his own place. (KJV)

Definition: Transgressions-3847 parabasis (par-ab'-as-is); from 3845; violation, 2) metaphorically, a disregarding, a violating b) the breach of a definite, promulgated, ratified law: KJV-- breaking, transgression.

Rom 2:23

23 Thou that makest thy boast of the law, through **breaking** the law dishonourest thou God? (KJV)

Rom 4:15

15 Because the law worketh wrath: for where no law is, there is no **transgression**. (KJV)

Rom 5:14

14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's **transgression**, who is the figure of him that was to come. (KJV)

Gal 3:19

19 Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of **transgressions**, till the seed should come to whom the promise was made; and it was ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. (KJV)

1 Tim 2:14

14 And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived was in the **transgression**. (KJV)

Heb 2:2

2 For if the word spoken by angels was stedfast, and every **transgression** and disobedience received a just recompence of reward; (KJV)

Heb 9:15

15 And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the **transgressions** that were under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance. (KJV)

Definition: iniquity transgression-458 anomia (an-om-ee'-ah); from 459; illegality, i.e. violation of law or (genitive case) wickedness, 1) the condition of without law a) because ignorant of it b) because of violating it: KJV-- iniquity, X transgress (-ion of) the law, unrighteousness.

Matt 7:23

23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work **iniquity**. (KJV)

Matt 13:41

41 The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do **iniquity**; (KJV)

Matt 23:28

28 Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and **iniquity**. (KJV)

Matt 24:12

12 And because **iniquity** shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. (KJV)

Rom 4:7

7 Saying, Blessed are they whose **iniquities** are forgiven, and whose sins are covered. (KJV)

Rom 6:19

19 I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to **iniquity** unto **iniquity**; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness. (KJV)

2 Cor 6:14

14 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with **unrighteousness**? and what communion hath light with darkness? (KJV)

II Th 2:3

3 Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of **sin** be revealed, the son of perdition; (KJV)

II Th 2:7

7 For the mystery of **iniquity** doth already work: only he who now letteth will let, until he be taken out of the way. (KJV)

Titus 2:14

14 Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all **iniquity**, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. (KJV)

Heb 1:9

9 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated **iniquity**; therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows. (KJV)

Heb 10:17

17 And their sins and **iniquities** will I remember no more. (KJV)

I Jn 3:4

4 Whosoever committeth sin **transgresseth** also the **law**: for sin is the **transgression of the law**. (KJV)

Definition: Transgressors-459 anomos-

1) destitute of (the Mosaic) law of the Gentiles 2) departing from the law, a violator of the law, lawless, wicked

Luke 22:37

37 For I say unto you, that this that is written must yet be accomplished in me, And he was reckoned among the **transgressors**: for the things concerning me have an end. (KJV)

Acts 2:23

23 Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by **wicked** hands have crucified and slain: (KJV)

1 Cor 9:21

21 To them that **are without law**, as **without law**, (being not **without law** to God, but under the law to Christ,) that I might gain them that **are without law**. (KJV)

II Th 2:8

8 And then shall that **Wicked** be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming: (KJV)

1 Tim 1:9

9 Knowing this, that the law is not made for a righteous man, but **for the lawless** and disobedient, for the ungodly and for sinners, for unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers, (KJV)

2 Pet 2:8

8 (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed his righteous soul from day to day with their **unlawful** deeds;) (KJV)

I Jn 3:4 Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law. (KJV)

I Jn 3:4 ... committeth sin (KJV)

2 Cor 12:21

21 And lest, when I come again, my God will humble me among you, and that I shall bewail many which have sinned already, and have not repented of the uncleanness and fornication and lasciviousness which they have committed. (KJV)

James 5:15

15 And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. (KJV)

I Jn 3:8-9

8 He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.

9 Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God. (KJV)

I Jn 3:4 ... transgresseth also the law: (KJV)

Rom 3:20

20 Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin. (KJV)

Rom 4:15

15 Because the law worketh wrath: for where no law is, there is no transgression. (KJV)

James 2:9-11

9 But if ye have respect to persons, ye commit sin, and are convinced of the law as transgressors.

10 For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all.

11 For he that said, Do not commit adultery, said also, Do not kill. Now if thou commit no adultery, yet if thou kill, thou art become a transgressor of the law. (KJV)

I Jn 3:4 ... for sin is the transgression of the law. (KJV)

Rom 7:7-13

7 What shall we say then? Is the law sin? God forbid. Nay, I had not known sin, but by the law: for I had not known lust, except the law had said, Thou shalt not covet.

8 But sin, taking occasion by the commandment, wrought in me all manner of concupiscence. For without the law sin was dead.

9 For I was alive without the law once: but when the commandment came, sin revived, and I died.

10 And the commandment, which was ordained to life, I found to be unto death.

11 For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it slew me.

12 Wherefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good.

13 Was then that which is good made death unto me? God forbid. But sin, that it might appear sin, working death in me by that which is good; that sin by the commandment might become exceeding sinful. (KJV)

I Jn 5:17

17 All unrighteousness is sin: and there is a sin not unto death. (KJV)

I Jn 3:4 ... additional scriptures (KJV)

Rom 5:13

13 (For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. (KJV)

Rom 7:5

5 For when we were in the flesh, the motions of sins, which were by the law, did work in our members to bring forth fruit unto death. (KJV)

Phil 3:9

9 And be found in him, not having mine own **(1)righteousness**, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the **(1)righteousness** which is of God by faith: (KJV)

Definition: (1)own or **righteousness** which is of God-1343 dikaiosune-1) in a broad sense: state of him who is as he ought to be, righteousness, the condition acceptable to God a) the doctrine concerning the way in which man may attain a state approved of God b) integrity, virtue, purity of life, rightness, correctness of thinking feeling, and acting 2) in a narrower sense, justice or the virtue which gives each his due. **1342 dikaios**-righteous, observing divine laws
