3947 paroxuno (par-ox-oo'-no);
from 3844 and a derivative of 3691; to sharpen alongside, i.e. (figuratively) to exasperate:
KJV-- easily provoke, stir.

Acts 15:39 And the contention was so sharp between them, that they departed asunder one from the other: and so Barnabas took Mark, and sailed unto Cyprus; (KJV)

Heb 10:24 And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: (KJV)

2052 eritheia (er-ith-i'-ah);
perhaps as the same as **2042**; properly, intrigue, i.e. (by implication) faction:
KJV-- contention (-ious), strife.

2042 erethizo (er-eth-id'-zo);
from a presumed prolonged form of 2054; to stimulate (especially to anger):
KJV-- provoke.

Rom 2:8 But unto them that are contentious, and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, indignation and wrath, (KJV)

a primary verb; properly, to lead; by implication, to bring, drive, (reflexively) go, (specially) pass
(time), or (figuratively) induce:
KJV-- be, bring (forth), carry, (let) go, keep, lead away, be open.

a variation for **4066**: KJV-- brawling, contention (-ous).
4066 madown (maw-dohn');

from 1777; a contest or quarrel: KJV-- brawling, contention (-ous), discord, strife.

Prov 18:18 The lot causeth contentions to cease, and parteth between the mighty. (KJV)

Prov 18:19 A brother offended is harder to be won than a strong city: and their contentions are like the bars of a castle. (KJV)

Prov 19:13 A foolish son is the calamity of his father: and the contentions of a wife are a continual dropping. (KJV)

etc.): KJV-- friend.
