

Finally, be ye all of one mind

1 Pet 3:8 Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous: **9** Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.(KJV)

1 Pet 3:8 Finally, be ye all (1)of one mind, (2)having compassion one of another, (3)love as brethren, (4)be pitiful, (5)be courteous:

Definitions: (1)of one mind-3675 homophron (hom-of'-rone); from the base of 3674 and 5424; like-minded, i.e. harmonious: KJV-- of one mind, concordant. (2)having compassion one of another-4835 sumpathes (soom-path-ace'); from 4841; having a fellow-feeling ("sympathetic"), i.e. (by implication) mutually commiserative, suffering or feeling the like with another, sympathetic: KJV-- having compassion one of another. (3)love as brethren-5361 philadelphos (fil-ad'-el-fos); from 5384 and 80; fond of brethren, i.e. fraternal, 1) loving brother or sister, b) used of a Christian loving Christians: KJV-- love as brethren. (4)be pitiful-2155 eusplagchnos (yoo'-splangkh-nos); from 2095 and 4698; well compassioned, i.e. sympathetic: KJV-- pitiful, tender-hearted. (5)be courteous-5756 tapeinophron (tap-i-no'-frohn); related to 5013; found only in 1 Pet. 3:8; the Textus Receptus has philophrones (See 5391): humble, humble-minded.

1 Pet 3:8 ... be ye all of one mind, (KJV)

Acts 2:1 And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. (KJV)

Acts 4:32 And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and of one soul: neither said any of them that ought of the things which he possessed was his own; but they had all things common. (KJV)

Rom 12:16 Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits. (KJV)

Rom 15:5 Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus: (KJV)

1 Cor 1:10 Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. (KJV)

1 Pet 1:22 Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: (KJV)

1 Pet 2:17 Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king. (KJV)

2 Pet 1:7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. (KJV)

I Jn 3:14 We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death. (KJV)

Acts 27:3 And the next day we touched at Sidon. And Julius courteously entreated Paul, and gave him liberty to go unto his friends to refresh himself. (KJV)

Acts 28:7 In the same quarters were possessions of the chief man of the island, whose name was Publius; who received us, and lodged us three days courteously. (KJV)

Eph 4:31 Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: **32** And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. (KJV)

Eph 5:1 Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; **2** And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour. (KJV)

Phil 4:8 Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things. **9** Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you. Col 3:12 Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; (KJV)

1 Pet 3:8 ... additional scriptures (KJV)

Rom 12:10 Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;(KJV)

2 Cor 7:13 Therefore we were comforted in your comfort: yea, and exceedingly the more joyed we for the joy of Titus, because his spirit was refreshed by you all. **14** For if I have boasted any thing to him of you, I am not ashamed; but as we spake all things to you in truth, even so our boasting, which I made before Titus, is found a truth. **15** And his inward affection is more abundant toward you, whilst he remembereth the obedience of you all, how with fear and trembling ye received him. **16** I rejoice therefore that I have confidence in you in all things.(KJV)

2 Cor 13:11 Finally, brethren, farewell. **(1)Be perfect**, be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you. **12** Greet one another with an holy kiss. **13** All the saints salute you. **14** The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen.(KJV)

Definitions: (1)Be Perfect-2675 katartizo (kat-ar-tid'-zo);from 2596 and a derivative of 739; to complete thoroughly, i.e. repair (literally or figuratively) or adjust: KJV-- fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.to render, that is, to fit, sound, complete, to mend (what has been broken or rent), to repair, to complete, to fit out, to equip, to put in order, to arrange, to adjust to fit or frame for oneself, to prepare, ethically, to strengthen, to perfect, to complete, to make one what he ought to be: KJV-- fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

Eph 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. **11** Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. **12** For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.(KJV)

Phil 2:1 If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies, **2** Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. **3** Let nothing be done through strife or **(1)vainglory**; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. **4** Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. **5** Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:(KJV)

Definition: (1)vainglory-2754 kenodoxia-1) vain glory, groundlessself, esteem, empty pride 2) a vain opinion, error

Phil 3:1 Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you, to me indeed is not grievous, but for you it is safe. **2** Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the concision. **3** For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.(KJV)

2 Tim 2:22 Flee also youthful lusts; but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord **out of a pure heart**. **23** But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender **(1)strifes**. **24** And the servant of the Lord must not (2)strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient, **25** In meekness instructing those (3)that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; **26** And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will.(KJV)

Definitions: (1)strifes-3163 mache (makh'-ay); from 3164; a battle, i.e. (figuratively) controversy, a fight or combat a) used of those in arms, a battle b) used of persons at variance,

disputants, etc., strife, contention c) a quarrel: KJV-- fighting, strive, striving. **(2)strive**-3164 machomai (makh'-om-ahee); middle voice of an apparently primary verb; to war, i.e. (figuratively) to quarrel, dispute, to fight a) used of armed combatants, or those who engage in a hand to hand struggle b) used of those who engage in a war of words, to quarrel, to wrangle, to dispute : KJV-- fight, strive. **(3)that oppose themselves**-475 antidiatithemai (an-tee-dee-at-eeth'-em-ahee); from 473 and 1303; to set oneself opposite, i.e. be disputatious: KJV-- that oppose themselves.

Titus 3:2 To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle, shewing all meekness unto all men.(KJV)

I Jn 4:21 And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also.(KJV)
