

ADD TO YOUR FAITH (2)

2 Pet.1:7

2 Pet 1:1-15

1 Simon Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to them that have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and our Saviour Jesus Christ:

2 Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord,

3 According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

4 Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.

5 And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge;

6 And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;

7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.

2 Pet 1:7

7 And to **(1)godliness** brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness **charity**.(KJV)

Definition: (1)godliness-2150 eusebeia (yoo-seb'-i-ah); from **2152**; piety; specially, the gospel scheme: **KJV-- godliness, holiness**.1) reverence, respect. 4576 sebomai (seb'-om-ahee);middle voice of an apparently primary verb; to revere, i.e. adore: **KJV-- devout, religious, worship**.

2 Pet 1:7 **brotherly kindness**; 5360 philadelphia (fil-ad-el-fee'-ah); from **5361**; fraternal affection: **KJV-- brotherly love (kindness), love of the brethren**.1) love of brothers or sisters, brotherly love 2) in the New Testament, the love which Christians cherish for each other as brethren from **5384** and 80; fond of brethren, i.e. fraternal: **KJV-- love as brethren**.properly, dear, i.e. a friend; actively, fond, i.e. friendly (still as a noun, an associate, neighbor, etc.): **KJV—friend**:

John 13:34-35

34 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

35 By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

Rom 12:10

10 Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; (KJV)

1Thes 3:12

12 And the Lord make you to increase and abound in love one toward another, and toward all men, even as we do toward you: (KJV)

1Thes 4:9-10

9 But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another.

10 And indeed ye do it toward all the brethren which are in all Macedonia: but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more; (KJV)

Heb 13:1

1 Let brotherly love continue. (KJV)

1 Pet 1:22

22 Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: (KJV)

1 Pet 2:17

17 Honour all men. **Love the brotherhood.** Fear God. Honour the king. (KJV)

I Jn 3:13-19

13 Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you.

14 We know that we have passed from death unto life, **because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death.**

15 Whosoever **(1)hateth his brother is a murderer:** and ye know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in him.

16 Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.

17 **But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need,** and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?

18 My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth.

19 And hereby we know that we are of the truth, and shall assure our hearts before him.(KJV)

Definition: (1)hateth-3404 miso (mis-eh'-o); from a primary misos (hatred); to detest (especially to persecute); by extension, to love less: KJV-- hate (-ful).

2 Pet 1:7charity-26 agape (ag-ah'-pay); from 25; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast: **KJV-- (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love. 25 agapao-**1) used of persons: to welcome, to entertain, to be fond of, to love dearly 2) used of things: to be well pleased, to be contented at or with a thing:

1 Cor 13:1-8

1 Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal.

2 And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing.

3 And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing.

4 Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,

5 Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

6 Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;

7 Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.

8 Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away.(KJV)

Gal 6:10

10 As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. (KJV)

Col 3:14

14 And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. (KJV)

1Thes 5:15

15 See that none render evil for evil unto any man; but ever follow that which is good, both among yourselves, and to all men. (KJV)

1 Pet 3:8

8 Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous: (KJV)

I Jn 4:21

21 And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also. (KJV)

2 Pet 1:7 ... additional scriptures (KJV)**1 Cor 14:1**

1 Follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy.

1 Cor 16:14

14 Let all your things be done with charity. (KJV)

Eph 4:32

32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. (KJV)

1 Tim 1:5

5 Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and of a good conscience, and of faith unfeigned: (KJV)

1 Pet 4:8

8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins. (KJV)

II Jn 1:5

5 And now I beseech thee, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment unto thee, but that which we had from the beginning, that we love one another. (KJV)

2 Pet 1:8-15

8 **For if these things be in you, and abound**, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

9 **But he that lacketh these things** is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.

10 Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: **for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:**

11 For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

12 Wherefore I will not be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, though ye know them, and be established in the present truth.

13 Yea, I think it meet, as long as I am in this tabernacle, to stir you up by putting you in remembrance;

14 Knowing that shortly I must put off this my tabernacle, even as our Lord Jesus Christ hath shewed me.

15 Moreover I will endeavour that ye may be able after my decease **to have these things always in remembrance.**(KJV)
