

## PERFECTION

### **Matt 5:38-48**

- 38 Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth:  
39 But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.  
40 And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also.  
41 And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain.  
42 Give to him that asketh thee, and from him that would borrow of thee turn not thou away.  
43 Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.  
44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;  
45 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.  
46 For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same?  
47 And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so?  
48 Be ye therefore **perfect**, even as your Father which is in heaven is **perfect**.(KJV)

**Definition: (1) Perfect**-from 5056; complete (in various applications of labor, growth, mental and moral character, etc.); neuter (as noun, with 3588) completeness: KJV-- of full age, man, perfect(1) brought to its end, finished 2) wanting nothing necessary to completeness 3) perfect 4) what is perfecta) consummate human integrity and virtue b) used of men, full grown, adult, of full age, mature

### **Luke 8:13-14**

- 13 They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away.  
14 And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to **perfection**.(KJV)

**Definition: (1) Perfection;** to be a bearer to completion (maturity), i.e. to ripen fruit (figuratively): KJV-- bring fruit to perfection.

### **John 17:21-23**

- 21 That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me.  
22 And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one:  
23 I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me.(KJV)

**Definition: (1) Perfect**-accomplish, or (figuratively) consummate (in character): KJV--

consecrate, finish, fulfil, make) perfect 1) to make perfect, to complete; to carry through completely, to accomplish, to finish, to bring to an end 2) to complete (perfect) a) to add what is yet wanting in order to render a thing full b) to be found perfect 3) to bring to the end (goal) proposed 4) to accomplish; to bring to a close or fulfilment by event; used of the prophecies of the Scriptures

### **2 Cor 13:7-9**

7 Now I pray to God that ye do no evil; not that we should appear approved, but that ye should do that which is honest, though we be as reprobates.

8 For we can do nothing against the truth, but for the truth.

9 For we are glad, when we are weak, and ye are strong: and this also we wish, even your **perfection**.(KJV)

**Definition: (1) Perfect**-thorough equipment (subjectively): KJV-- perfection, a strengthening, a perfecting of the soul, a training, disciplining, instructing

### **Heb 6:1-3**

1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God,

2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

3 And this will we do, if God permit.(KJV)

**Definition: (1) Perfection**from 5048; a completer, i.e. consummator: KJV-- finisher. a perfector, one who has in his own person raised faith to its perfection and so set before us the highest example of faith

### **Heb 7:10-12**

10 For he was yet in the loins of his father, when Melchisedec met him.

11 If therefore perfection were by the Levitical priesthood, (for under it the people received the law,) what further need was there that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec, and not be called after the order of Aaron?

12 For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law.

**Definition: (1) Perfection**-(the act) completion, i.e. (of prophecy) verification, or (of expiation) absolution: KJV-- perfection, performance a completing, a perfecting, fulfilment, accomplishment, the event which verifies the promise, consummation, perfection

### **James 1:1-4**

1 James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad, greeting.

2 My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations;

3 Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience.

4 But let patience have her **(1)perfect work**, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing

**Definition: (1)Perfect** ;from 5056; complete (in various applications of labor, growth, mental and moral character, etc.); neuter (as noun, with 3588) completeness: KJV-- of full age, man, perfect. brought to its end, finished,wanting nothing necessary to completeness, perfect, what is perfect, consummate human integrity and virtue, used of men, full grown, adult, of full age, mature

**1 Pet 5:6-11**

6 Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time:

7 Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.

8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:

9 Whom resist stedfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world.

10 But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you **perfect**, stablish, strengthen, settle you.

11 To him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.(KJV)

**Definition: (1)Perfect**; to complete thoroughly, i.e. repair (literally or figuratively) or adjust: KJV-- fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore, to render, that is, to fit, sound, complete, to mend (what has been broken or rent), to repair, to complete, to fit out, to equip, to put in order, to arrange, to adjust to fit or frame for oneself, to prepare, ethically, to strengthen, to perfect, to complete, to make one what he ought to be
